Dear Stable Permit Holders,

The 2024 stable permit renewal form is attached!

Please send in your administrative permit fee of \$7, plus \$50 trail maintenance fee for each horse on your property that uses the trails. The maximum trail fee per stable is \$1,250.

Stable Permit Holders like you play a big part in maintaining the quality, accessibility and connection that trails provide throughout the Town of Woodside. Half of the overall Trails Maintenance Budget comes from Trail User fees, which are exclusively used for trail maintenance and improvements, and are matched by an allocation from the Town's General Fund.

Special thanks to those who go above and beyond by making generous donations to the Trail Fund. These funds are held in reserve and used to defray the costs of key projects such as the Center Trail Bridge.

The Trails Committee works closely with Town staff, Circulation, Livestock & Equestrian Heritage committees, San Mateo County and local residents, to manage Woodside's public trail systems.

Our recent projects include the completion of the new Kings Mountain equestrian bridge over West Union Creek, damaged by the 2022 storms. The lighted equestrian / pedestrian crossing project at Kings Mountain Road and Woodside Road is scheduled for the summer months. Future plans include, expanding the system and increasing overall connectivity with a trail that connects Wunderlich and Huddart Parks, creating a safe connection on Portola Road to Wunderlich Park and trail improvements in the Emerald Hills areas of Glen Crag and Jefferson.

We encourage community input and look forward to working with fellow residents on projects. We welcome you to join us at a Trails Committee meeting, every second Thursday of the month at 3 pm.
