The 2025 stable permit renewal form is attached. Please complete the form, provide an email, and indicate the correct number of horses on your property. The new **eTRAKIT** system features renewal and payment online by **credit card** or **E-check**. See attached instructions.

Stable Permit Renewal Fee: \$7 and trails fee: \$50 for each horse that uses the trails. Additional donations are always welcomed and greatly valued.

If your barn currently has no horses but you elect to keep the barn permit active you are helping to keep Woodside "Horse Country". We appreciate it!

Stable Permit Holders play a big part in maintaining the quality, accessibility and connection that trails provide throughout the Town of Woodside. The Trails Committee works closely with Town staff, Circulation, Livestock & Equine Heritage committees, San Mateo County and residents, to manage, maintain and improve Woodside's public trail systems.

All fees directly help the Trails Committee's mission. We will assist property owners with reinstating a barn permit that lapsed. Reach out with any questions!

The Town's trail crew can be seen working in the community and if you encounter them, take a moment to express your gratitude as they work tirelessly for the benefit of all trail's users!

Projects recently completed include the pedestrian/equestrian crossroads at Kings Mountain Road and Woodside Road intersection and the Romero crossing on Canada Road. Future plans include expanding the system and increasing overall connectivity with a trail between Wunderlich and Huddart Parks, creating a safe connection on Portola Road to Wunderlich Park and trail improvements in the Emerald Hills areas of Glen Crag and Jefferson.

We encourage community input and look forward to working with fellow residents on projects. Community members are welcome to join us at a Trails Committee meeting, every second Thursday of the month at 3 pm.
